As I am thinking about Easter, which will take place on April 12th this year, my mind is taken to the prophet Isaiah, who prophesied Jesus' crucifixion more than 700 years before it happened. Two verses of Scripture come to my mind. The first comes from Isaiah 52:14 which says, "His visage was so marred more than any man, and His form more than the sons of men," and the other comes from Isaiah 53:10 which says, "It pleased the Lord to bruise Him."

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ was beaten so badly that He was unrecognizable. He was scourged with 39 lashes, which peeled His skin off, beaten across His face countless number of times, His forehead was pricked with a sharp crown of thorns, and He was nailed to a cross all the while carrying every sin that every person in the past, present, and future has ever committed on His shoulders. 
From the **MINISTER**
